Generally, I'm looking for historical fiction set after the 18th century, with a particular love of anything set in the UK, Ireland, Russia, (or a dark and stormy coast). I'm a bit tired of brilliant women who want to escape the torment of high society. I'd rather see brilliant women who love high society and want to use it to their advantage, à Lady Mary Crawley of Downton Abbey.

I love books with morally ambiguous plots and unlikeable protagonists in the vein of Amy Dunne and Emma Woodhouse. I recently read The Beloveds by Maureen Lindley and was kept up all night by the sheer brilliance/crazy evil of the main character. That said, while I like books with unlikeable/unreliable main characters, I don't want anything with sadism/brutality/torture.

I enjoy gorgeously written literary and upmarket fiction, but I want it to have a commercial hook. The prose needs to sweep me away, but the plot should be strong as well.

Please send me historical fantasy/speculative fiction like Circe, The Snow Child, Life After Life and A Secret History of Witches. These are some of my favorite books in the world and I'm dying for more. That said, I am not a good fit for epic fantasy.
